

w	(Ruapehu Mountain Club Association)

•	Arlberg Ski Club, is a long standing member of the Ruapehu Mountain Club Association. The RMCA represents over 50 member clubs from Iwikau village, Whakapapa and National Park. The key purpose of the RMCA is to advise and co-ordinate responses to matters arising that may impact the activities of the member clubs. As such the RMCA works closely with Ruapehu Alpine Lifts (RAL), Department of
Α	Conservation (DOC) and the Ruapehu District Council (RDC). The RMCA also provide and manage the lwikau grocery room which Arlberg uses and the RMCA Group Insurance Scheme.
R	The key focus during the past year has been the Clubs' license renewal with DOC. The license allows the clubs to operate within the Tongariro National Park. The main discussion item during the renewal process was 'enabling future viability for the lodges/clubs'. Although no significant changes were made
L	to the license, the renewal process provided good discussion. In April, RMCA held its bi-annual forum at Whakapapa. This is an opportunity for club representatives
В	to work together, learn and discuss items of interest such as; DOC and RAL future planning, electricity price challenges, waste collection and recycling, Whakapapa sewage scheme and club membership opportunities. Linda Danen (RMCA Councilor) and Michael McLean attended this year's forum on
E	behalf of Arlberg Ski Club.
R	Currently on the table is the 'trial' Tongariro National Park Building Code driven by DOC, and open to feedback on the code for 12 months from 1 July 2013. Key impacts include: • DOC require that any building work to be properly supervised by a competent person approved is a logical parameter.
G	 A works approval is required for all works affecting the external part of any building, any
•	 A works approval is required for all works affecting the external part of any building, any internal work that increases or decreases the number of bunks in any building
С	• Colour palates for Iwikau – When Arlberg re-paints the roof, the colour will need to change.
0	In October the RMCA held its AGM followed by presentations from RAL and RDC. Items of news included:
	 Engineering Consulting firm, AWT, engaged to redesign the waste water treatment facility. There are 2 years left to run on the discharge consent.
N	• RAL concession licenses up for renewal, Turoa in 2 years Whakapapa in a few years.
7	 Clubs that have a waiting list and that are well booked for weekends have ski programs in place.
	• The RMCA insurance scheme has reopened for additional clubs to join. Note: Arlberg committee will review this option when the insurance is up for renewal in 2014.

Arlberg Ski Club has relied on Volunteer Labour from new and existing members to give freely there time and efforts / skills, in building, maintaining and upgrading the club for all to enjoy, there are fixed rules to joining the membership & Five yearly work party requirements have been well publicized via the news letters and minutes from the AGMs on the website.

However although a very large group of existing members have all been personally emailed to remind them of this and to either contact Maintenance or Membership. This has largely been passed over by the intended recipients. Please contact Maintenance and Membership to advise your situation. The Maintenance manager is aware of only one email passed to Committee and discussed regarding this issue, What are the rest of you doing?

As members appear to be more time constrained to carry out their work party commitments, this is causing a rethink at committee level. There is also an increasing amount of compliance & licensing within the Building Sector and DOC have put in there own requirements as well. An option:

For getting maintenance and improvements completed; pay professionals to carry this out, as there appears to be a decreasing source of skilled people within our club membership, and off set the costs by an increase Annual Subs and or implement a Work Party levy each & every Year, with the option of having this amount deductible if a work party is attended, alongside trade's people.

We are also looking at other options for aged seniors.

We are interested in feedback to this idea from you, or any other options thoughts or suggestions. With the AGM looming in April changes will have to be made, to keep the club building safe, healthy and economically viable.
